

## **Curriculum Intent**

Through an inclusive approach based on compassion, knowledge and the understanding, the Arts will ensure that students build an appreciation of a wide range of creative works. This will include the traditional such as Art, Music and Drama, as well as the more contemporary including Photography, Film, Media, Dance and Music Technology. Through exciting, challenging, and diverse experiences, the Arts will become a passion that lasts a lifetime and informs how students view the world in which they live.

## **Key Stage 4 Art**

Art is a subject which allows those who study it to develop their own personal way of interpreting the genres of landscape, still life and portraiture. Art is a personal form of self-expression. It engages students with the world around them. Art is a diverse subject that encourages students to explore a variety of different art materials and subject matter, which will develop their creative skills. Students will have the opportunity to produce work that demonstrates their own perspective on the world around them

Art encourages students to develop a range of transferable skills which are valuable for any sixth form or college course, whether or not it has an artistic focus. Art students learn to plan effectively, solve problems, demonstrate creative vision and manage time, resources and differing media. They are able to articulate and justify decisions, use research and experience to inform decision making, and have excellent communication skills, both verbal and visual, which enable them to form clear political and social arguments

Coursework (a portfolio of work that shows how students are developing as an artist) which makes up 60%. Exam (externally set assignment) which makes up the remaining 40%. People who study Art go on to be artists, architects, designers, fashion designers, set designers, inventors, interior designers, involved in film and television sets/ props/ costumes, linked to design in theatre, writers, journalists, reviewers.
