Year 12 Motorcycle Company-Triumph Ltd in Hinckley. - Tour, Presentation & Exhibition -

The tour around the factory allowed students to gain first hand insight into the systems and processes in design and manufacturing. This tour touched on many theoretical topics covered throughout their A-level Product Design and Engineering course, such as casting, 3D printing, quality control, efficiency in manufacturing, spray painting and Health & Safety to name a few.

Walking around the exhibits students were able to learn about the design and







making processes and components that go into production of motorcycles, which was useful to reference the work and theory learnt. The Presentation focused on possible career paths within Triumph and the roles of different professionals, like CAD Designers; Engineers and some examples of problems they solve and Riders who carry out tests in different weather conditions, as well as the business aspect and how they promote the brand and liaise with various sectors to expand their brand.

**Netball Leaders** - Two weeks ago, year 7,8 and 12 students supported the Primary Bee netball competition at Ashby School as netball umpires.
