To develop <u>critical insights</u> into, and contact with, the contemporary society, cultural background and heritage of countries or communities where the foreign language is spoken.

To learn <u>transferable skills</u> such as autonomy, resourcefulness, creativity, critical thinking and linguistic, cultural and cognitive flexibility which will enable you to proceed to further study or employment using languages.
