## What's been happening...

**'Eco-Homes' that our Y9 students have made this half-term. -** The aim of the project was to not only think about eco-friendly practices (recycling, walking to school etc.) but to focus on more sustainable ways to build homes and live with the landscape. The students worked in groups to research, design, make and then present back their vision for an eco-home of the future that captured the ideas we had discussed in the lessons earlier in the unit.



Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> October - Oxford University Visit - We were delighted to welcome ambassadors from the University of Oxford for their annual visit this term. The team delivered a range of engaging sessions aimed at informing and inspiring our Key Stage 4 and 5 students about higher education and future pathways.

Selected Year 10 students explored opportunities in higher education, while Year 11 received valuable guidance on A level choices and setting aspirations for the future. Our Year 12 cohort benefited from advice on post-18 pathways and took part in a critical thinking skills webinar,



while Year 13 Oxbridge applicants were supported through one-to-one application guidance.

Both staff and students shared **excellent feedback**, describing the sessions as motivating and informative. We are excited to build on this partnership and are already planning a **visit to the University of Oxford in December**.

We were delighted to welcome back a former student who is now studying Mathematics at the University of Cambridge. She spoke to our Year 12 and 13 students about the Oxbridge application process, sharing her own experiences and offering valuable advice on choosing a college, writing a strong personal statement, and preparing for admissions tests and interviews. Her insight and guidance gave our students a real sense of what applying to and studying at Cambridge is like, and we are grateful for the inspiration she provided to those considering a similar path.
