

Outstanding Achievement Awards

Congratulations to former 6th Form students Beth Laming and Liam Riddick on receiving £200 each for their outstanding achievements at A level.

Ashby de La Zouch Endowed schools Foundation was pleased to present Beth and Liam with £200 each for their outstanding performance in their A levels.

Beth received the Prance Award, which recognises a student who has achieved high grades and is progressing to Cambridge. Beth is now studying Natural Sciences. This money comes from a fund called the Prance Exhibition what was set up in 1942 to help support students who had achieved excellent results and has secured a place at either Oxford or Cambridge University.

Liam was awarded the Woodcock Prize and is now studying Automotive Engineering at Loughborough University. This prize arises from a fund set up in 1960 "for a student who is outstanding in excellence or ability".

The Foundation Vice Chair Margaret Hawksworth was pleased to meet the two students and recognised all the arduous work Beth and Liam had undertaken to secure their excellent results, she also talked to them about an enjoyable first term at university.
