Operations Updates

School Drop-off and Pick up/Parking

A polite reminder to help make school drop-off and pick-up times more pleasant for everyone in our community.

Exams

February trial exams for Year 11 and 13 (including some year 12s)

These trial exams are taking place from 23/02/2026 – 05/03/2026. Candidate timetables were emailed to parents on 06/01/26, along with important exam information. Timetables will be printed and issued to students, via their CREW Leader, in the coming days.

Ashby School's resilience arrangements:

In line with Ofqual's guidance, our trial exam papers in the Spring term form our 'exam resilience' arrangements, with students being assessed under exam-like conditions. For example, students will not know the questions in the assessment beforehand, will work independently and without assistance (other than as required for a reasonable adjustment), will not have access to books or revision notes, will be supervised during the assessment and will be assessed under timed conditions equivalent to those under which they would expect to complete the assessment (or part of an assessment) during their exam.

Assessment evidence collected and retained under this guidance will only be used to determine grades in the unlikely situation that exams and formal assessment cannot go ahead. Original work will be kept but students can have copies of their work to assist them with learning and for feedback purposes.

Communication Update - REMINDER

A reminder that we are moving some communications to the School Newsletter and/or Arbor App notifications. We advise you to allow push notifications on the Arbor App, if you haven't already done this. If you don't have this enabled, you may still receive emails to inform you when a notification is sent to you. You will still receive some communications via email, including the fortnightly newsletter, urgent notices, specific trip information for your child and behaviour communications. We will evaluate this approach in the Spring term and thank you for your understanding whilst we improve our systems.

Food Preparation and Nutrition

KS3 Design Technology - Students have now rotated Design Technology groups. Students who are now in Food Prep and Nutrition will find their practical lesson dates and ingredients on Arbor. They also need to bring an apron, and a container to take home their cooking.

Year 11 Food Prep and Nutrition. - Students this will be bringing home extended exam question booklets. Students are to complete one question a week for homework, and then the answers will be reviewed in class. Details of due dates are on Arbor.

Students will also be completing their NEA 2 practical element this half term, which accounts for the majority of the marks for NEA 2. There are no set recipes, or provided recipes for this, students are required to source and plan their own recipes. Mobile phones cannot be used in the sessions so all recipes **MUST** be printed. For the final all-day session, students must use a plan which they will write in lessons.

Students cannot deep fat fry and cannot use nuts.

For the all-day exam, students are expected to lay a table out, so will need tablecloths and presentation dishes. (We have a limited number in school).

Students will be off timetable for all elements of the practical sessions, and it is very important that they attend the sessions, as it is hard to find time to catch up.

What's been happening...

December Sparx Maths Update - Each week, we reward our students for doing their Sparx Maths homework. For every week of homework completed, we give students: a positive point on Arbor, a raffle ticket and a chance to build up to our half termly and termly rewards. In lessons, students who have done 100% of their Sparx Maths homework that week are entered into a spin the wheel and can earn a mini prize each week. Our termly raffle was drawn on Wednesday 17th December and our winners each received a Christmas Selection Box. Raffle tickets will be reset ready for the new term after Christmas, and the next raffle will take place on Tuesday 24th March 2026. Raffle tickets will be earned each week up to that date. There will be DOUBLE RAFFLE TICKETS issued for the Sparx Maths homework due on 7th January 2026 and 25th February 2026, giving our students a whopping 13 chances to earn raffle tickets before the draw. We also run an initiative called "The Secret Class". Each week one class in each year group is selected (at random, in secret). When the deadline is passed, the Sparx Maths completion for the whole class is checked, and if it is 100% the class win a prize. This term we had three different Secret Class winners. 101Ma1 won it in week X, 91Ma1 won it in week X and most recently, 71Ma3 won it in week X. There is a real buzz around the secret class in lessons, and we hope to see many more classes being celebrated as the Secret Class in the Spring term.

The next wave of rewards will be issued in the week commencing 12th January, where we will be recognising students for having 100% completion for 2 half terms (or 1 half term if they missed out last time). 2 half terms at 100% will earn students a certificate and a postcard home, so keep an eye out for these!

TOP TIPS



Keep away from the edge of the water



Only walk in well lit areas



Keep dogs on their leads



Walk with an adult or group of friends



Never go on the ice under any circumstances

WHAT TO DO IN DANGER



Shout help and call 999. Use your what3words location



Never go onto the ice to try and rescue a person or animal



Keep an eye on the person in danger



If possible lie flat to spread your weight



Wait for the emergency services
